NOTEWORTHY ACTIVITIES:

Charged a female who has called 911 over 100 times since January.

Code Enforcement is moving forward. She has initiated 11 cases as reflected in the monthly numbers and to date 8 have been remediated and 2 are in progress.

GPD continues to work well the GASD Officer. We have assisted him in several cases recently, including a child armed with scissors and today with an individual threatening staff at a school. He has also come off campus and checked the status of our Officers on calls.

I was recently invited to speak to a class during Crisis Intervention Training. CIT incorporates mental health components, de-escalation and the court system into a 40 hour program and helps prepare Officers and others for dealing with people in crisis. It is taught by several people from the mental health system including our own co-responder Kay Martin.
