

Special Meeting, Nov. 26, 1932.
Hoachlander Garage, 8:30 P. M.

A Special Meeting of Greencastle Borough Council was held on the above date.

Members present: Councilmen, Stover, Hoachlander, Leshner & Frank.

In the absence of the President, Roy W. Stover was elected President Pro Tempore.

It was announced that the meeting had been called for the purpose of discussing the advisability of calling a certain bond issue to the amount of \$ 5,000 on Jan. 1, 1933 and to consider other pertinent business.

After due consideration, a motion was passed authorizing the redemption of \$ 5,000 in 5 % Bonds on Jan. 1, 1933; this issue being known as "The Fifth Loan" comprising bonds Nos. 436 - 445 inc. of \$ 500 each, issued Jan. 1, 1915 and all becoming due and payable Jan. 1, 1940; the motion also authorized the Treasurer to give the necessary notice to the holder of these bonds and to the First National Bank, and to make all necessary arrangements for the redemption of this issue.

Following discussion the subject, it was decided to begin work on the removal of the railway tracks from East Baltimore Street on Monday Nov. 28th.

By resolution it was agreed that Jacob Harmon be employed during the term of the above work on the following terms: To work two days each week under the relief act; to work one eight hour day each week at 20 ¢ per hour, the same to be applied to taxes which he owes Borough; but that he is to be in the shop six days each week.

The Street Committee was authorized to purchase from the First National Bank certain sledges and other tools for the use of the department of streets.

On motion, meeting adjourned.
