

Special Meeting. Miller & Friedley Store,

January 18th. 1933. 1:00 P. M.

A special meeting of Council called by the secretary for the purpose of considering the purchase of a motor water-sprinkler or other business that might come before the body, met in the office of the Miller & Friedley store room at the above hour and date.

Members present were: Councilmen, Stover, Hoachlander, Miller and Leshner.

In the absence of President Gardner, Mr. Roy W. Stover was elected President Pro-tem.

Mr. Stover explained the desirability of purchasing the motor water-sprinkler from the First National Bank, and on motion of councilman Miller, seconded by councilman Leshner, that the borough purchase the said sprinkler for the sum of \$ 100.00, and that the secretary make necessary arrangements to have the title transferred to the borough. Motion passed without dissent.

Councilman Stover stated that officials of the King Playground had asked the Borough to assist in the laying of oil-bound paths on the playground to replace those now made of loose gravel. It was explained that the area to be built would be approximately 750 sq. yds. and the Playground association promised to pay at least \$ 25.00 toward defraying the expense of this improvement.

On motion of Mr. Miller, seconded by Mr. Hoachlander the street committee was authorized to furnish the necessary stone, oil and labor and to lay approximately 750 sq. yds. of paths on the King Playground when weather conditions were favorable; it being understood that the Playground would make payment of at least \$ 25.00 toward the expense incurred.

On motion, meeting adjourned.
