

Special Meeting, Jan. 13, 1934.
First National Bank, 9:00 P. M.

A special meeting of Council was called on the above date for the purpose of conferring with a representative of the CWA and to consider additional projects for the purpose of giving work to a larger number of unemployed.

Present:- Councilman Hoachlander, Stover, Gilland, Seibert, Walck and Davison. (Mr. Wagner of the CWA was also present.)

Due to the absence of Mr. W. Earl Gardner, Dr. W. E. Seibert was nominated and elected President Pro-tem.

Dr. Seibert explained that the meeting had been called for the purpose of considering undertaking the building of a concrete storm sewer on Franklin Street, the connecting of various "dead ends" of the water system, or such other work as Council might decide.

It was explained by Mr. Wagner that a federal grant of approximately 20% of all monies expended by the Borough under the Penn'a. Relief plan could probably be secured to be used for purchase of materials for new projects undertaken under the CWA.

A check over the records by the secretary indicated that approximately \$ 10,673.20 had been expended on the Relief work.


Pending further word concerning approval from the CWA, it was decided that new projects should be considered in the following order:-

First:- The building of a concrete storm sewer on Franklin St. in either of two squares or for the entire two squares, depending upon later developments.

Second:- That the more important connecting links be laid in the water system to eliminate "dead ends".

On motion of Mr. Davison it was agreed that a 4 in. water main be laid along Walters Avenue, connecting the mains on N. Carlisle and N. Allison Streets.

On motion, council adjourned to meet at the call of the president to consider these projects more fully as soon as more details were available.
