

Regular Meeting, Aug. 6, 1934
Council Hall, 8:00 P. M.

The regular August meeting of Council was held on the above date with the following present:-

Burgess D. W. Shinham, and Councilmen Walck, Seibert, Davison, Stover and Hoachlander.

On account of the absence of Pres. Gardner, L. R. Walck was elected Pres. Pro. Tem. and presided at the meeting.

Minutes of the last regular meeting were read and approved without correction.

The secretary read letters from S. S. Lewis, Sec. of Highways in which it was stated that additional oiling would be done on the streets within the near future.

A letter was read from Attorney J. W. Hoke, in which he voiced objection to the deduction of \$ 25.00 made from his statement received at the last meeting, and stated that he felt that he was entitled to the full amount of \$.75.00 as billed. On motion Mr. Hoachlander, seconded by Seibert, it was ordered that Mr. Hoke be paid the additional \$ 25.00; this however not to establish a precedent as to what his salary should be.

Letter from Mr. Hoke with reference to pavements at Rahausers etc. was read. On motion Dr. Seibert, seconded by Stover, it was agreed to employ the County surveyor to make a new survey of the line and grades with a view to locating such lines in a manner that would be agreeable to all parties concerned; and to proceed toward having pavements laid, by amicable agreement if possible.
