Special Meeting, Council Hall, October 6, 1934: 9:30 P. M.

A special meeting of Council, called by the President was held on the above date.

Present: Burgess Shinham, President L. R. Walck, and councilmen Gilland, Seibert, Davison, Stover & Friedly.

The secretary stated that the meeting had been called for the purpose of considering the situation that had arisen by the approval of a certain work project or survey of borough streets and property. It was brought out that application for this project had been made by the Burgess; that he same had been approved in Harrisburg; and that work was expected to start within a few days; also that orders for certain supplies had been placed. It was also brough out that the **matter** had never been brought before Council for discussion or action.

An opinion from attorney Hoke stated that the signing of this application by the Burgess without first being approved by the Council did not constitute a legal act, and that Council was not obligated in any way toward any expense, should the survey be conducted.

On motion by Dr. Seibert, seconded by Mr. Davison, council wished to go on record as not favorable to this project, and the secretary was instructed to notify the proper persons that the application made by the Burgess was not in legal form and that Council would not be responsible for any expenses, should the survey be conducted.

Light. Gilland, Chairman, Walck; Friedly.
