

Regular meeting, Nov. 4, 1935

The regular November meeting was held on the above date with President Walck presiding and the following members present:- Councilmen Davison, Friedly, Stover, Seibert, Gilland and Hoachlander. Burgess Shinham was also present.

Minutes of the last regular meeting and two special meetings were read by acting secretary Dr. W. E. Seibert, who was appointed by the President to act in the absence of John J. Carl. Minutes were approved without correction.

On motion Dr. Seibert, seconded by Mr. Stover, the Burgess and president of Council together with three citizens' expenses for trip to Harrisburg to appear before the Public Service Commission in the hearing for the abandonment of the railroad were ordered to be paid.

On motion Dr. Seibert, seconded by Mr. Davison, the Street Committee was authorized to purchase a one and one-half ton dump truck for work on the Carlisle Street project for an amount not more than \$ 500.00. Motion carried unanimous.

On motion Mr. Stover, seconded by Dr. Gilland, the President was empowered to confer with Mr. John W. Hoke and to act upon his advise with regards to the payment of compensation insurance on relief workers during 1932 and 1933 as per Chambersburg's method of handling the same situation. Motion unanimously carried.
